Visions of Home, Now on Display

Resthaven's Care Center proudly unveiled its inaugural photography competition and exhibit. The unveiling event, held on April 18th, featured light desserts and refreshments and saw a remarkable turnout of nearly 100 attendees, creating a vibrant and engaging atmosphere.

The exhibit, themed "Close to Home," encouraged local photographers to capture the essence of "home" through images of local landscapes, familiar points of interest, and significant events. This year's competition received an impressive 100 submissions, each aiming to evoke memories, stimulate conversations, and forge connections among the residents.

The Honorable Ed Post, a seasoned photographer with more than 35 years of experience in landscape and nature photography, acted as judge for the curated exhibit. Judge Post's expertise and dedication brought a high level of quality and professionalism to the selection process.

The exhibit features 20 carefully chosen photographs, with an additional 15 images included in a special gallery exhibit. Awards were presented for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in the Judge's Choice category, and an additional People's Choice winner, which was voted on at the unveiling event.

The selected photographs are now displayed on the walls of Resthaven's Care Center, providing residents, their families, and team members with a source of beauty, inspiration, and conversation. This initiative not only honors the artistic contributions of local photographers but also significantly enriches the daily lives of our residents.

"I was blown away by the support and participation of the local photography community. It has been incredibly fulfilling to witness the excitement of the exhibit from the earliest submissions to now seeing the impact it is having on the residents, families, visitors, and team members. I am excited to repeat this initiative next year, with the theme "Up Close Along the Lakeshore," said Jason Bucher, Administrator of Resthaven's Care Center, who spearheaded the competition and exhibit.

Keeping Safety Top of Mind

On Wednesday, May 15th, Resthaven, the Holland Fire Department, the Tri-County Fire Inspectors Association, and EV Construction collaborated to develop and exercise an emergency response plan for The Farmstead campus.

"Resthaven is proud of the collaborative relationship we have fostered with the Holland Department of Public Safety over the years, and pleased that we were able to host and participate in this simulation to best serve our residents at The Farmstead," said Patrick Cioffi, Director of Facilities Operations at Resthaven.

Fire inspectors and departments from all over the state of Michigan toured the independent living facility, developing a working plan to be used later in the morning for a functional exercise, which involved a fire simulation of an electric vehicle in the underground parking garage. In this scenario, the Holland Fire Department and its mutual aid partners responded to the

simulated fire, coordinating with Resthaven team members to activate the plan. Volunteer "victims" from Resthaven and EV Construction were stationed throughout the building for evacuation.

The event concluded with a post-incident analysis, providing practical information to Resthaven and the Holland Fire Marshal to finalize an effective response plan for the campus. Afterward, participants enjoyed a lunch prepared by the Farmstead's Executive Chef, Justin Smith.

This successful collaboration highlights Resthaven's commitment to safety and preparedness, ensuring the well-being of our residents and strengthening our community partnerships.











Together, We Grow

It was a beautiful May evening for friends of Resthaven to gather at The Ivy House in Saugatuck for the Celebration of Caring. With delicious food, lively music, refreshing beverages, and a robot serving dessert (more on this later), we celebrated the remarkable growth of Resthaven and our ongoing commitment to growth for our residents, our team, and our community.

Deedre Vriesman, Resthaven's President/CEO, reflected on the organization's journey from 1945 to today, thanking the many donors, volunteers, team members, and board members who have contributed to the 79 years of a strong, community-benefit senior living organization.

"Growth means more than just new buildings, of course; it's about enhancing the lives of seniors in our community. Growth in these areas may be less visible from the outside, but is the real reason Resthaven was created and continues to exist today, 79 years later," said Vriesman.

Vriesman also introduced Resthaven's first robot, named Rosie by resident vote. Rosie serves at The Warm Friend by Resthaven as an additional support to the dining team. At the Celebration of Caring, Rosie showcased her skills by serving desserts, impressing guests with her steady tray and keen ability to navigate obstacles.



The event also featured the premiere of the 2024 "Together, We Grow" video, highlighting the career development of Lina Jacobs, Resthaven's Administrator of Nursing. Lina, who started at Resthaven as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) 23 years ago, has advanced tremendously in her career at Resthaven. The video included a heartfelt testimony from Margie Amon, who shared her father Alan's positive experience since moving to Resthaven's Care Center last year. The video concluded with wise words from Jim Bultman, President Emeritus of Hope College, who spoke about the ways Resthaven, as a not-for-profit organization, benefits our entire community.

Lifelong Learning

Growth, development, and learning are not confined to a specific age. In fact, they are celebrated as essential elements of a fulfilling life. This spirit is wonderfully exemplified by one of our vibrant residents at The Warm Friend, Tessa. Along with Julie, a virtual co-teacher, Tessa has been teaching Spanish classes to fellow residents at The Warm Friend for the last year.

Tessa's love for Spanish is profound, rooted in her early fascination with culture and language. Armed with four years of high school Spanish, she pursued degrees in the language from Indiana University and New York University. Her career spanned various roles, culminating in teaching Spanish at an Ivy League institution, the University of Pennsylvania. There, she taught 1st, 2nd, and 3rd-year Spanish courses. This passion grew as she spent nearly four years living in Madrid and made numerous trips to Mexico. Tessa's deep connection to the language is palpable in her teaching, where she shares not just linguistic skills but also the rich cultural tapestry of the Spanish-speaking world.

After retiring in 2015, she moved back to Texas, eager to continue sharing her passion for Spanish. It was through networking in Texas that Tessa met her co-teacher, Julie, in 2019.

Since moving to The Warm Friend in February 2023, Tessa has continued her mission of teaching. Every Monday, a group of four women gather for Spanish class. In addition to the Monday classes, Tessa holds a Spanish study hall on Thursdays and offers one-on-one office hours by appointment, demonstrating her commitment to growth and learning for all of her students.

Another resident of The Warm Friend, Audrey, feels very fortunate to have so many opportunities available to her. Audrey, who has been enjoying the Spanish classes since they started, participates in numerous additional offerings at The Warm Friend, such as cardio drumming, book club, and exercise. She traveled to Mexico numerous times following retirement, and was eager to continue to learn the Spanish language.



Audrey believes lifelong learning is incredibly important. "Learning something new stimulates my brain," Audrey says. "It's so much fun. Tessa is a great teacher."

Through Tessa's dedication and enthusiasm, she embodies the essence of lifelong learning. Her classes at The Warm Friend are a testament to the fact that growth and discovery are ageless pursuits. Residents here are not just living; they are thriving, continually exploring new horizons, thanks to inspiring individuals like Tessa.

"The beauty of the language attracted me to Spanish," Tessa says. "It's beyond the language; it's the culture, the people, the music. It's all so fascinating."
